

8th October saw the 6th month anniversary of the Sustainable Stoneham Community fridge launch and what a six months it has been.I thought it might be a good opportunity to share some of the statistics from the past 6 months.

- 3.3 tonnes of surplus food saved from going to landfill
- 404 individuals from the community have donated surplus food to the fridge
- 2675 individuals have taken surplus food from the fridge
- 330 hours spent by our dedicated volunteers doing checks, cleans and collections
- 5 days per week we have restocks from our corporate partners

We've been absolutely blown away by the success of this initiative and we have big plans to grow what we are doing. Some of these plans include expanding our daily restocks to 7 days per week, purchasing a freezer so we can reduce even more waste, and we have been given funding from the Asda Foundation do this, running more cookery workshops to teach essential life skills and help with budget meal ideas and even a second fridge location but we can't do this without your help as we need more volunteers. If you can spare as little as 30 minutes per month to help, please get in touch. We offer a fully funded food hygiene course and certification to all our volunteers, a full induction and training plan and warm welcoming team of volunteers. February 2023 saw the first NSP jumble sale to raise muchneeded funds for NSCG and to support the community fridge via Sustainable Stoneham, we could not have predicted just how successful and popular this event would be raising more than £600 to benefit the local community. Feedback was overwhelmingly positive and so it was decided that this would become a regular event. The next jumble in August was combined with a free school uniform exchange and both were well attended raising almost £400 and giving away over 40 items of uniform completely free of charge.

2nd December 2023 will see our community exchange stall at the popular Christmas light switch-on event, offering a completely FREE Xmas jumper, coat and gift exchange, Donations of boxed and/or re-giftable toys, as well as reusable jumpers and coats for all ages, are accepted on the day, or any time beforehand but please remember that you don't have to donate anything to take something and you don't have to take anything if you donate something. Moving towards 2024, we plan to run three jumble sales and the first will be January 21st at 2 pm, so please save the date.

As well as your attendance we would also be very grateful for any jumble donations you can spare, Clothes of any description as well as toys, books, baby items, bric-a-brac, bedding, homeware, electronics, etc, anything in good clean condition please. Could you spare an hour or two on the day to help setup, man the tables or pack down? Your time is greatly appreciated and it's a great way to get involved with your local community, this event is run entirely using volunteers and 100% of the money raised is ploughed back into the community.



We are all volunteers, many of us work, and we all juggle other things with being Trustees for NSCG. We'd love to hear your hopes and dreams for NSP and we'd also love your help! There are lots of ways to become involved and many don't mean a regular commitment.

We can pay for you to take an online Food Hygiene course (90 minutes) if you are part of the fridge team.

YMCA Volunteers Needed

Lots of the activities at the YMCA either can't happen or are made so much better by volunteers. There are lots of opportunities, many don't have to be every week as we can put a rota together and some can just be when it suits you! YMCA trains all our volunteers and rewards them too...volunteers get 30% off all café costs all the time and room bookings at substantially reduced rates too! Here are our current needs:

Toddler Group:

Could you set up and take down for the toddler group on Wednesdays 10-12 (with set up and take down 9.30-12.30). If we can find more than one person it could be once a month on a rota. Could you support play during the toddler group by chatting to people, maybe even running some play? The YMCA are trying to get funding for soft play equipment. Having community volunteers will help with grant applications.

Gardening:

Could you help keep our garden tidy and volunteer perhaps an hour a week or even a month at a time that suits you? Youth Club Could you help with our Thursday youth club which runs from 4.15-to 6.15? We have all the resources but just need people willing to hang out with our fabulous young people.

Nursery:

Could you be a lunchtime assistant and help us at this busy time of day? An hour a week on a day that suits you would be an amazing help to us.

Chatty Café:

Could you spend an hour talking with people on our Chatty Café table? We'd love to have people on hand, Monday to Friday, particularly from 11-3pm. An hour a week or more would be great and you even get a free drink and biscuit!
