They are an important part of what NSCG is about as they promote sustainability, encouraging people to 'exchange' things they don't need for things they do!

#### Sustainable Stoneham Community Fridge

As we approach the first anniversary of the launch of our community fridge it's a great time to reflect on what we have achieved. We originally set out with a goal of saving two tonnes of surplus food in our first year, and we achieved that within the first five months of opening the fridge. In 2023 the fridge saved and redistributed 6.4 tonnes of surplus food to more than 4500 members of the Eastleigh community, with a whopping 1.5 tonnes redistributed in December alone.





You may have seen in November 2023 King Charles launched his Coronation Food Project with an aim to bridge the gap between food waste and food need across all four nations of the United Kingdom, helping people and helping the planet. It was great to see that the King has caught up with us here at Sustainable Stoneham and encouraging us all to become #FoodWasteWarriors. #### Is NSCG a Charity?

North Stoneham Community Group was set up in March 2021 to put on community events and initiatives for the local community. A community group has a constitution which sets out how it operates and makes decisions but is not a charity. Community groups are only allowed to have an annual budget of £5,000. As the activities of NSCG have grown so has our budget. It now costs over £12,000 per year to run all our events and initiatives, including the community fridge and newsletters. All of NSCG funding comes from grants and donations e.g. the jumble sales. This means that NSCG is in the process of becoming a charity. It's a complicated process but we hope to have news to share with you before the end of the summer.

#### **YMCA 'MATTERS'**

Hello, Derren Storey your YMCA Community Manager here. As we settle into the new year there are a few things I'd love us to have a natter about:



#### Together WE Make a Difference

Firstly, a big thank you for your continued support of your community centre. It's very much appreciated and wonderful to watch it grow in both content and custom. I want you to know that by supporting your community centre you make a difference.

The YMCA is a charity. This means that any profits we make go into the running of our centres for public benefit, or into other charitable purposes. You might not know that one of these charitable purposes is housing centres, and I recently had the opportunity to visit one. These housing centres host young people who, for many reasons, have fallen on bad times and simply need a bit of extra help and support. They need someone who is there for them, to guide them back onto a positive path. That's what the YMCA centres do and to see their work first-hand and hear their success stories; how they nurture the young people's sense of self-worth and belief in themselves is nothing short of amazing.

So what I'd really like you to hear is that whether you just use the YMCA café, or come in for kids activities, to drop a child in the nursery or indeed all the above, the income you bring to the YMCA makes a difference as it helps to drive incredible initiatives like the young peoples' centre and so helps children, young people and families lead healthier, happier lives. So, thanks.

#### **Easter Holiday Kids Activities**

The YMCA is a community centre which means we want to also make a difference to our local community. That's why we offer so many activities for children, young people, and families. 

#### Easter Bake Off


